



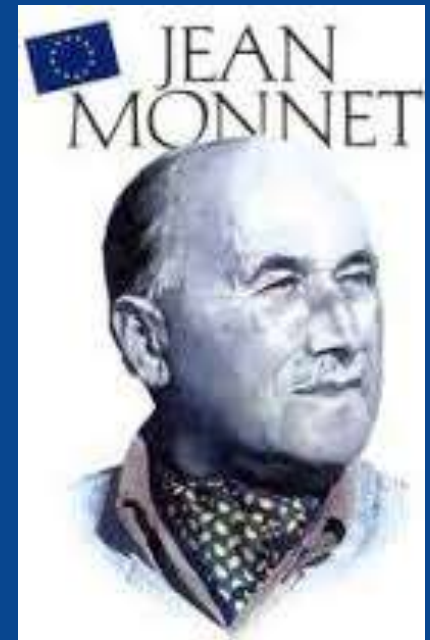
Jean Monnet Activities

Historical background



The Jean Monnet Programme was launched in 1989 aiming to facilitate the introduction of “European integration studies in universities”.

The programme takes the name of Jean Monnet (1888-1979), one of the ‘architects’ of the European Union, “The Father of Europe”.

Teaching and research in the field of EU-studies

- **MODULES**

Min 40 teaching hours/year, 3-year grants (max grant: € 30.000)

- **CHAIRS**

Chair Holder: Min 90 teaching/year + at least 1 additional activity/year, 3-year grants (max grant: € 50.000)

- **CENTRES OF EXCELLENCE**

Focal points of competence and knowledge, 3-year grants, (max grant: € 100.000)

Policy debate with the academic world

NETWORKS:

Who: consortia of international players (*HEIs, Centres of Excellence, departments, etc.*) specialized in EU studies.

Activities:

- Gathering information, exchanging practice, building knowledge and promoting the European Integration process.
- Enhancing cooperation between different HEI and other relevant bodies inside/outside Europe.
- Creating a high knowledge exchange platform with public actors.

Partner: 3 institutions from 3 different countries,

Duration: 3-year grants

Budget: max grant: € 300.000

PROJECTS:

Who: HEI – active organisations in EU subject area.

Activities: support innovation, cross-fertilisation, spread of EU content:

- *Developing and delivering appropriate pedagogical content for school students.*
- *Training and continuing education for teachers*
- *Support the creation of EU Studies and enhance the level of knowledge of a department, staff in a given faculty/school.*
- *Organize conferences, seminars and delivery of courses on EU.*
- *Information and dissemination activities.*

Duration: 12 - 18 – 24 months

Budget: max grant: € 60.000

Support to Associations

Support to Associations:

Who: Any association of professors and researchers specialized in the EU studies (*officially registered and has legal status*)

Activities:

- Perform research in European subjects.
- Collecting information and providing analysis and visions on specific subjects.
- Associations legal activities i.e. organisation of annual board meeting and promotional events for more EU visibility, publication of a newsletter, launching website.

Duration: 3-year

Budget: max grant: € 50.000

Jean Monnet Activities – Overview

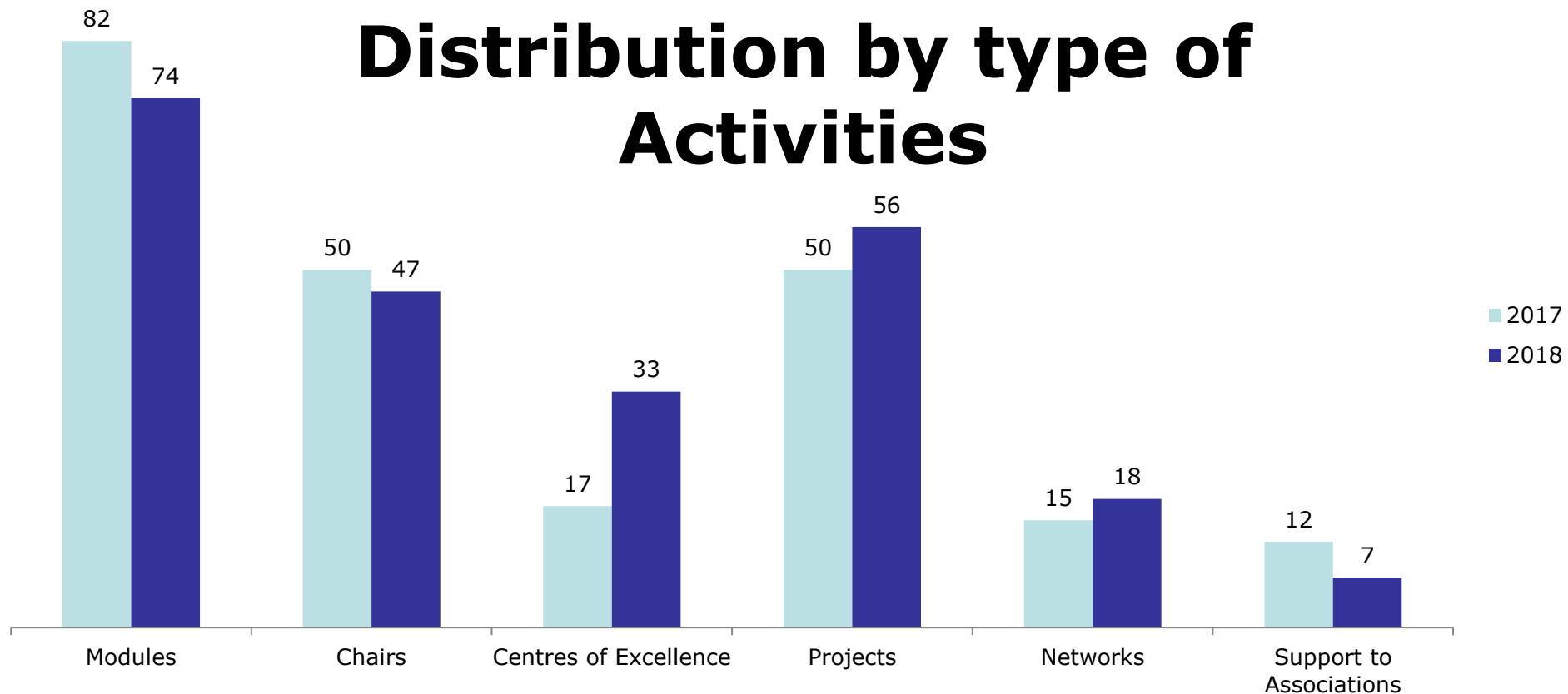

Jean Monnet Selection Results 2018

- Submitted applications: 1255
- Selected projects: 235
- Budget: € *14.5 million*
- Acceptance rate ~ 19%

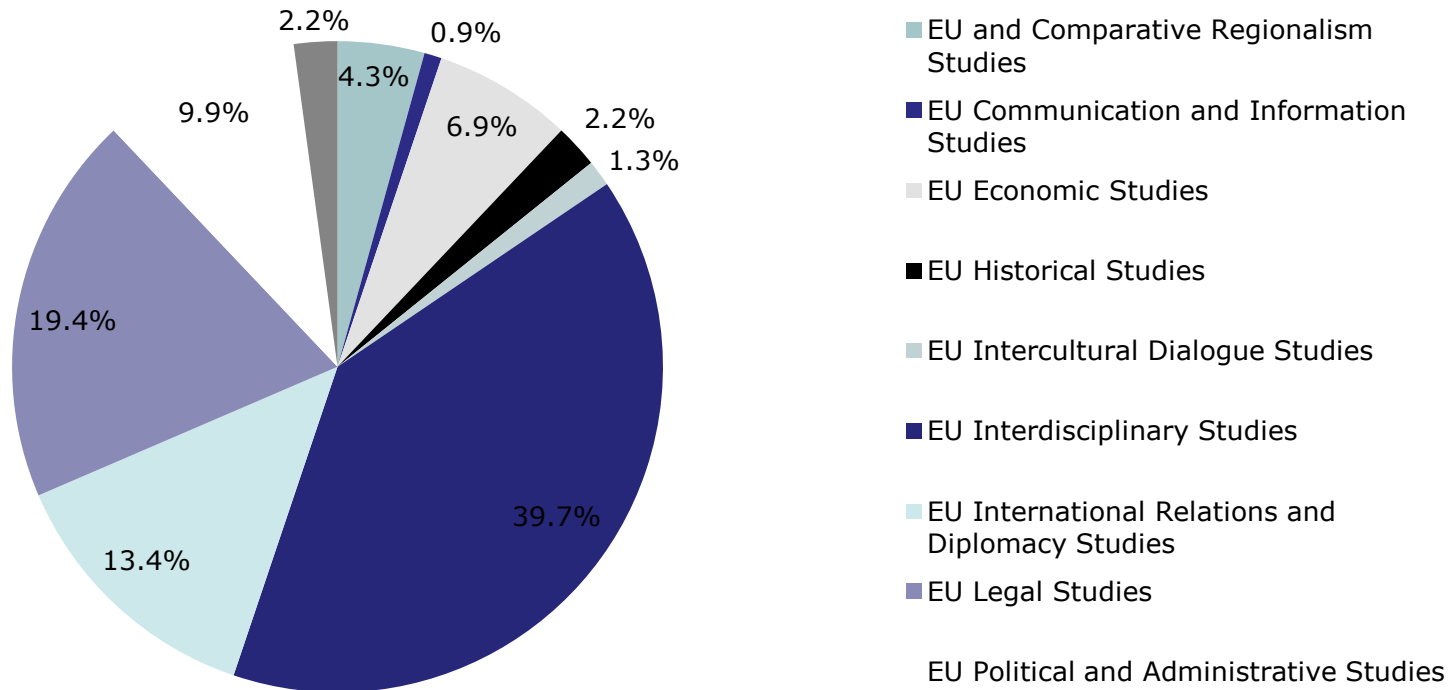
Jean Monnet Selection results 2018

Next Call for Proposals 2019

Steps	Dates*
Publication of the Call for proposals 2018 - EAC/A05/2017	October 2018
Deadline for submission of applications	February 2019
Verification of eligibility, expert assessments	March – Mai 2019
Evaluation Committee for selection of projects	June 2019
Award decision	July 2019
Notification of applicants and publication of results on EACEA website	July 2019
Preparation of Grant Agreements/Decisions	From August 2019 on
Start of projects	1 September 2019

How to apply?

- Apply directly to Executive Agency (EACEA)
- Applicants from all countries
- Applicants: HEIs or organisations active in EU subject area, depending on the action type
- Only one applicant institution is required / except Networks
- **Budget: around € 12 million**

How to apply?

- *Participant Portal / Participant Identification Code (PIC)*
- *Create official electronic application form (eForm)*
- *Fill in eForm **and 3** attachments: (Project Description, Budget and DoH)*
- *Attach completed versions of different attachments to the application/e-form*



Successful Story: Jean Monnet Module “EuroMed Relations From Southern Perspective”

- Beneficiary: Cairo University – Faculty of Economics and Political Science.
- Duration: 3 years – 2010 to 2013 with one year extension (auto-finance) 2014.
- Budget: Total Cost: 25.536 euro, the agency co-financed with 19.152 euro.
- Number of Lectures: 60 lectures (3 hours each).
- Number of stakeholders: 90 participants
- Number of instructors: 32 (Egyptian and European Professors, Ambassadors, Experts in the EU Relations).
